It appears that the late Town Trust on the 3 of July resolved upon levying a rate not exceeding in the whole, the sum of £400. for which they applied and received the Governor's sanction by letter dated 7th August 1858. They further resolved that, the above amount, should be levied in two equal instalments, not less than months intervening between the Collections.

There being no law then existing for the collection of these sums by a poundage rate, the Town Trust apportioned the first instalment upon the various tenements liable to be rated. (vide paper signed G Shenton Chairman Perth Town Trust) This first instalment has however never been collected or applied for and the second instalment was never apportioned by the late Town Trust.

The following questions arise.

1st Have the City Council under No X 22nd Vict. power to collect the first instalment of the abovementioned instalment.

2nd Have they power to apportion and Collect the second instalment.
